2003 Scholarships

One of the main purposes of your South Pasadena High School Alumni Association is to award scholarships to South Pasadena High School graduates who continue their education beyond high school. Over 95% of South Pasadena graduates continue on to college. Only graduating seniors may apply for scholarships.

Applicants must be planning to attend a community college, four year college or university, nursing, trade or vocational school to pursue training in a trade or a Bachelor's Degree. They must have a GPA of 2.5 or better.

Your alumni association Scholarship Committee evaluates the applicants based upon finan-

cial need, scholastic record, school and extra curricular activities, community service, and work experience. The evaluation concludes with a personal interview by members of the Alumni Association Scholarship Committee.

The selection is made by the Committee and awards are announced at the Awards Presentation Ceremony held in early June of each year. Funding of scholarships is made upon evidence of enrollment by the student in the selected educational institution.

Since the first two \$200 scholarships were awarded to two students in 1982, the Association has awarded one hundred and fifty one scholarships totaling \$280,950.

Established scholarship funds include the **General Fund**, **The Fosselman Fund** for junior college and trade school bound students and the **Albert Adams Fund** for music students.

Your Alumni Association

The purpose of the Alumni Association is:

1. **To promote, manage and award scholarship funds for deserving students.**
2. **To provide a channel of communication among SPHS, its graduates, students, and other persons interested in the welfare of the school.**
3. **To maintain a directory of SPHS graduates and to coordinate reunion activities.**
4. **To preserve SPHS memorabilia.**
5. **To cultivate the heritage and dignify the traditions of SPHS.**

ATTENTION ALUMNI

The Alumni Association was founded in 1982. Since that time scholarships have been awarded to well deserving SPHS graduates. For each of the last three years a minimum of \$40,000 was awarded to anywhere from 10 to 15 graduates with scholarships ranging from \$1500 to \$5000. These graduates were very pleased and appreciative of their awards and have responded with the most beautiful and sincere letters of appreciation. These letters are printed each year in Tiger Tales.

Be assured that your contributions are making a difference in the lives of these graduates. As Alumni and Board Members, we would like to continue our commitment to provide scholarships for education into the future. We would like to award at least as many and in the same amounts as we have been giving the last three years to deserving graduates. **We cannot continue at this rate without your increased support.**

Thankfully, more and more of you are paying dues and making more donations than in the past. Your generosity keeps us afloat. We thank the present members

for their continued support.

There are, however, more than 11,000 of you out there who are not supporting us.

Dues are currently \$7.50 per year which amounts to only 2 cents per day. Think of what we could do with \$7.50 a year from 11,000 members. That is \$82,500 per year which would more than pay all of our expenses and double our scholarship awards. We believe we rank highly among High School Alumni Associations in this country and probably throughout the world based on publications and scholarships activity.

Are you doing your part? Are you doing anything to help?

Publication costs for the Tiger Tales and Tiger News have increased. The rising cost of these publications will eventually take away from scholarship awards. We believe that the SPHS Alumni do not wish this to happen to our award winning graduating students.

Your Board of Directors voted last June to increase membership dues to \$10.00 per year after June 30th of this year. This increase results in membership

dues of less than 3 cents per day or 19 cents a week. **Who among you cannot afford to contribute 20 cents a week?**

Membership dues are used to pay for publication costs and what little overhead that we have. Remember, we, your board, are all volunteers and get paid nothing. All dues, less expenses, go to the scholarship fund. All donations go to directly to the scholarship fund.

Please seriously consider becoming a member for less than 3 cents a day. An envelope is in the centerfold. Our goal is 100% participation by our alumni. Only you can accomplish that. Your reward is knowing you are helping to build America's future. You also will receive news of the Association's activities and "Tales" from your fellow classmates. Don't let the burden be on a few, let's all share. Just remember that your membership is an investment in your satisfaction and the education of current graduates. Please consider membership at the very least. Donations are greatly appreciated.

Millard Sheets Fresco Restoration Project - More Photos Needed

Clarice Schmitt Knapp '63 has been able to secure the services of the Getty Conservation Institute to investigate the condition of the painted over 1934 Millard Sheets frescoes in the three recesses on the northern exterior auditorium wall of the South Pasadena Junior High School (now Middle School). The Getty will use this project as a case study and publish the research and investigation results to assist other school districts in restoration of their own early artwork. Full restoration may proceed after determining the best approach and cost of uncovering each 10' by 14' panel. Work will begin in August.

Millard Sheets was a highly successful California artist who attended the Chouinard Art Institute in 1925 and was instructing there by 1928. Sheets founded the Scripps College art department in 1939 and headed it for decades. He was jointly responsible for over 40 artwork



installations for Home Savings of America. These extraordinary WPA frescoes were considered by him to be the most beautiful in Southern California.

Knapp's research has found only one black and white 1939 class photo of the middle panel (Pat Etienne's). Only one b/w photo and one 1966 colored slide of each of the others exists (Lee Hershberger's). Alumni who took **Photography class** with Mr. Lohman may hold some answers in their archives. Was your **class**

photo taken in front of these frescoes? Please contact Clarice Knapp. Extraordinary care will be taken to duplicate materials and return them. Copies will also be provided to the school and city library collections.

What's New at Your School

Thanks to the passage of a bond measure in 1995, South Pasadena High School has been treated to a \$20 million transformation. If you haven't yet visited the campus, I invite you to do so. NTD Architects were the designers, and they used the 1921 auditorium that is still in use as the basis for their Art Deco-inspired design.

One of the first changes to the campus was the addition of a

classroom building.

On Monday morning, January 7, 2002, our students and staff gathered in the new "plaza" area to celebrate the opening of our first new buildings. Next up on the construction front was the opening of our Practical Arts, Fine Arts, and Performing Arts classrooms, including a ninety-nine seat equity waiver theater. Spring was the time for occupying those buildings and for taking back the Tiger Patio.

By Valentine's Day, we opened the eight classes in our (Fremont-facing) Science building. With that, all that was left for modernization were the four classrooms in the middle of campus that we fondly call "The Goto Wing" (designated as such in honor of Mr. Goto's thirty-



practice gym next to the main gym. The practice gym is graced with a large Tiger Seal façade, courtesy of artist Tony Sheets.

Phase I included renovation of the large building that faces Fremont Avenue, the library, administrative offices, the one-story building (part of the original school) across from Holy Family, the Counseling and Career Center, and the transformation of the one-story Ramona Avenue building into a two-story, thirteen

something years in the same room in that wing) and the Cafeteria, Student bank, Student Activities Center building.

In the spring of 2002, in conjunction with Open House, we held a grand opening here for all parents and community members to tour the facility, celebrate with us, and get to know the new South Pasadena High School. In November, 2002, on the heels of

our successful project, South Pasadena's voters turned out in solid numbers and overwhelmingly supported Measure M, a new bond for facilities construction. Over three-quarters of those voting gave their approval, signaling again the incredible support that our community gives its schools. With Measure M, our Middle School will have much more suitable conditions in which students can learn. Additionally, SPHS likely stands to benefit from some additional changes, including three permanent classrooms, that could not be completed under the



previous bond measure.

Improvements continue on and around campus and, again, we invite alumni to visit. Look for the Tony Sheets friezes on the west side of the auditorium, as well as memorabilia from various classes that have been incorporated into the new campus, giving us a good blend of old and new.
