President's Letter/Editor's Note

My trek through South Pasadena schools began in 4th grade at Marengo. No surprise that I felt like an outsider, a stranger to this tight-knit community, this lush, green land. It was so different from the clear skies, dry landscapes and wide open spaces my brother, **Eric Gill '59**, and I had grown up accustomed to, in our southern Arizona desert roots.

Later years in class, I never shook that feeling of separation, though it must have looked otherwise to many. You could see it in the eyes of some who came in during Junior High, or whose fractured families had them alternating years between parents in whole different states – the lack of connection. **Hillary Swank '93**, who identifies herself as an SP Tiger [see TT 2015], didn't feel she fit in for the short time she was here, and so moved on. I've heard so many express the same thing.

After graduation, I kept in touch with very few, nor did I hit any reunions until our 25th. The timing worked out – I'd shed a few loose pounds, was in town that week. I was on a roll. It all seemed more solid, classmates grown from just kids to being real. I had a good time, and I thank **Richard and Susan Wilson Whitman '61** and **Bruce Marrs '61** for sharing their places with us on those balmy, late summer evenings. We miss **Joanne Lindsey Dickson '61** lending her property for so many different classes' reunions. And thanks to all those alums who continue to open their homes and host their classmates for these events. It makes magic!

Time moves on, more reunions, and I was pulled into the planning committee where I started doing reunion books. It's been my downfall; I enjoy pulling together publications. But it was my other obsession, computers, that caught **Bill Peters '53**'s attention, and I was soon ensconced with the Alumni Association taking on the Master database of all alumni.

From that view it was easy to see other connections in the Tiger community. **Al Trendle '47** and **Marilyn Ritters Bender '60** organized the first "official" Regional Reunions in Arizona. Not only was I back home, it was amazing celebrating across multiple decades of alumni, reflecting the same varied experience and perspective as the Board's 40-year spread. 



SCHOLARSHIPS

One of the major objectives of the South Pasadena High School Alumni Association is to award scholarships to qualified graduates each year. Scholarship applicants must be planning to attend a community college, four-year college or university, nursing, trade or technical school to obtain training in a trade or a Bachelors Degree.

Scholarships are awarded on the basis of: Financial need, Scholastic Record, School Extra-Curricular Activities, Community Service and Work Experience. Applicants will also participate in an oral interview with the Alumni Association Scholarship Committee.

Your Alumni Association has awarded \$522,950 to 249 graduates of South Pasadena High School over the years. The scholarship winners each year are listed in *Tiger Tales*, *Tiger News* and on the SPHSAA website. In addition, each recipient is given a one-year membership in the Alumni Association.

The high school's last Tiger Newspaper of the school year lists all the graduates, where they are going to college and what they want to major in. The school newspaper is one of the links on our website.

The General SPHSAA Scholarship Fund established in 1982 to award scholarships to seniors based on excellence, merit and need.



Harold Hartsough Scholarship award to those who have demonstrated compassion, unselfish mentoring and help to fellow students.



Albert Adams Music Scholarship provides funds for pursuing higher education in the field of music.



Karen Kincel Scholarship established to assist students interested in creative writing.



James Fosselman Scholarship for students planning to attend Pasadena City College.



Maggie Veir Art Scholarship for pursuing study in the field of visual arts.

Every year, during the third week of February, the SPHSAA scholarship forms are made available at the high school administration office, and may be downloaded from the SPHSAA website, as well as distributed by faculty and staff. The requirements for each of the six scholarships are specified on the application forms. Completed forms must be returned to the office before Spring Break. These are reviewed by the SPHSAA Scholarship Committee who are approved each year by the Board of Directors and are active

members of the Alumni Association. After verification of eligibility in April, finalists are selected, interviews conducted on a Saturday in May, and recipients announced at Awards Night in June. The scholarship funds are issued upon receipt of proof of registration for classes. Photographs of the students receiving these scholarships are printed in the Fall *Tiger Tales*, along with thank-you notes received before the August 31st publication deadline, as well as in the Spring edition of *Tiger News* the following year.

The South-Pas Hollywood Connection explored the roles SP students and a few faculty took on, many getting their start in drama at school. Going on to make it big on stage, in film, behind the scenes,

Robert Turkington '62 wrote, “Samatha Daukoz said as she received her Academy Award, ‘I would like to thank all of the little people who made this possible, but I can not remember their names.’ Maybe what I am writing here is silly, because I am not sure what the criteria was for the article. Below are listed people that probably should have been considered in the article. [This was exactly the intent, and further submissions of others omitted are welcome on this and other feature topics, for inclusion in future issues. - Ed.]

“**Alan Mylander '62** was part of the South Pasadena School system from his start in Lincoln Kindergarten to his graduation from High School in 1962. Upon graduation he went to Hollywood, where he became a grip. Alan was a grip for the rest of his life. His name appears in many movie credits, including some later ones where he was listed as a key grip.

“**Russell Doughton**, Adviser to the Thespians for 1960, 1961 and 1962. That is at least three years, which is as long as I was there. Russell was the producer of the original *The Blob*, which starred Steve McQueen. Russell was not proud of his association with that movie.

“**Al Broyles '62** went to Hollywood directly after High School. He was a walk on for two years on Richard Basehart’s *Voyage to the Bottom of the Sea*, and I have seen him in advertisements. He has survived in Hollywood for at least 50 years.

”**Lin Cariffe '62** was a set designer for many years. I do



not know if he was in Hollywood, or at the Pasadena Playhouse, but I know he made many sets. [Lin constructed many sets over the years but most were used in photo shoots for Broadway and I. Magnin ads.]

“**Bertha Ruise '62** was on TV for once a week when we were still in High School. She was on *Roller Derby*, which was at that time one of the most popular spectator Sports.

“I am certain that there must be many jobs such as script writers, costume designers choreographers, make-up people and even grips that were not listed in the article. I believe it is these 'little people' that make American movies a lot better than the Bollywood movies, and the other foreign films.”

Mike Garoutte '61 added, “I’ve just read the latest *Tiger Tales* from cover to cover – as I always do – and I was particularly interested in the SP-Hollywood story. I was in the Senior Play with Magda (**Nancy Parsons '61**), and I was so pleased that she had a successful acting career.

I would like to add two individuals to your list (and I’m sure there are others): **Russell Doughten** – okay, he

was a teacher, not a student -- but I thought you could include him alongside **James Jontz**. Russ was connected with the original movie, *The Blob* -- I’m not sure if he was an actor or production staff member.



Al Broyles '62 (professional name: Allan Hunt). He’s been doing TV commercials since he was a child, as his mother had connections in the industry. I know he had short stint on *All My Children*, as a sleazy lawyer trying to engineer a ‘baby sale.’ But I think his best shot was as a crewmember on TV’s *Voyage to the Bottom of the Sea*.



PLATINUM - \$5000 or More

Panthera tigris sumatae, the Sumatran tiger, is the smallest of all living subspecies.

GOLD - \$1000 to \$4999

Panthera tigris amoyensis, the South China tiger, is the most endangered with only 59 known.


